The Right to Silence: This seminar analyzes and reviews various examples of conceptually accurate interpretations of the *Miranda Warning*. The historic development of *Miranda v. Arizona*, ramifications of the Supreme Court decision and other subsequent relevant decisions will be reviewed. The session analyzes commercially available videos and discusses strategies to incorporate elements into one's work; considers textual density of the *Miranda Warning* and ways to incorporate the complex concepts. The workshop format includes: video analysis, lecture, group discussions/ activities, group/team work, and feedback processes. Participants will demonstrate an understanding of and be able to produce different interpretations of the *Miranda Warning*.

The Presenter: Ben Hall CSC, NIC, SC:L Over the past 30 years, Ben Hall has worked in all aspects of the profession: a freelance interpreter, interpreter educator, interpreter coordinator, staff interpreter for the State of Ohio, presenter and leader within the profession. Ben served 13 years on the national Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf (RID) Board of Director. He is a former member of the national RID/NAD National Council on Interpreting and assisted in the development of the National Interpreter Certification (NIC) exam and the Code of Professional Conduct. Ben is currently serving on the Supreme Court of Ohio Rules & Policy Subcommittee and the national Commission on Collegiate Interpreter Educators (CCIE).
