The dedication of the Marion County Judicial Center completes a project that began when the Kentucky General Assembly authorized it in 2006 and approved its funding in 2008.

“It is a privilege to celebrate with the people of Marion County as they dedicate this outstanding new judicial center,” Chief Justice of Kentucky John D. Minton Jr. said.

“Since the early days of the commonwealth, Kentucky courthouses have held a special place as the center of our communities,” he added. “The Marion County Judicial Center will provide an efficient facility where citizens can carry out court business and seek access to justice. I appreciate the county leaders and state legislators who joined the Judicial Branch in making this project a reality.”

The judicial center consists of approximately 33,000 square feet and includes space for Circuit Court, District Court, the Office of Circuit Court Clerk and ancillary services.

The new facility is designed to greatly enhance the delivery of court services. It is equipped with the latest computer, video and networking technology. The judicial center also provides the highest level of Kentucky court security through a single-point entry with magnetometers and security personnel. In addition, prisoners will be segregated from the public by separate entrances and corridors.

The Marion County Judicial Center was designed to meet the standards required by the Administrative Office of the Courts. The Sherman Carter Barnhart architectural firm of Lexington designed the building. Codell Construction Co. of Winchester was the construction manager for the project and Ross, Sinclaire & Associates, which serves Kentucky and six other states, is the financial agent.

As the administrative and fiscal agent for the state court system, the AOC oversees the construction and maintenance of court facilities statewide. The AOC also supports the activities of nearly 3,300 Kentucky Court of Justice employees and 403 elected justices, judges and circuit court clerks.
