Since 1999, the AOC has been responsible for preparing attorneys to provide legal representation to dependent, neglected and abused children throughout Kentucky.

The goal of the program is to produce highly qualified guardians ad litem by offering training sessions, providing educational materials and serving as a comprehensive resource.

The curriculum gives counsel for children an overview of Kentucky statutory and case law while also meeting the federal requirements set forth in the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act and the Adoption and Safe Families Act.

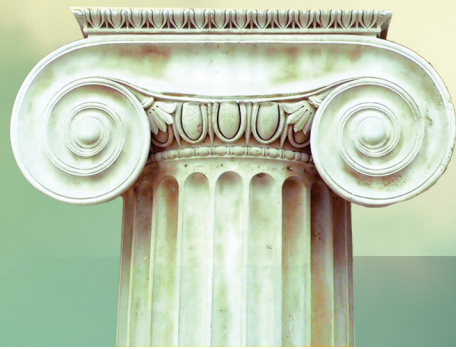
